

St. Croix Dolphins set 15 territorial records during swim meet

ST. CROIX — The St. Croix Dolphins swim team held an intersquad meet on Saturday at the Beeston Hill Fitness Center Pool and 15 territorial swimming records were set, according to a press release the team issued Wednesday.

Caylee Watson, who won the female 2-mile race at the 15th annual Coral Reef

Swim on Oct. 10, paved the record-setting day with nine new marks in the 15- to 17-year-old age group and open categories.

“The team swam very well for their first short course meet of the season,” St. Croix Dolphins coach John Vabinder said. “We had lots of best times in all age groups. The team goal will be to repeat that number in December.”

The Dolphins' next short-course meet

will be the Short Course Championships, which will be held Dec. 11 on St. Thomas.

In the 15- to 17-year-old age group and Open categories, Watson set new records in the 200-meter backstroke, 50m butterfly, 50m backstroke and 100m backstroke. She also set the new standard for the 100m individual medley.

Also in the 15- to 17-year-old age group, Bryson Mays set a new record in

the 100m butterfly while Brigitte Rasmussen did the same in the 50m breaststroke.

Tony Hendricks broke records in the 100m backstroke and 50m backstroke in the 11- and 12-year-old age group.

Webster Bozzo set a new standard in the 100m backstroke in the 9- and 10-year-old age group and Amanda MacKay broke the record in the 100m butterfly for the 8- and 9-year-old age group.
